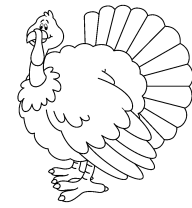

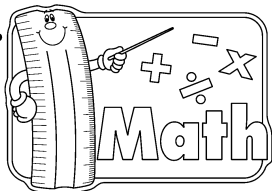


### Readers' Workshop

Students will be learning to read emergent storybooks. Emergent storybooks are books that the children have heard their teacher read multiple times. Rereading emergent storybooks helps children increase receptive language skills, vocabulary, and teaches them how stories go. Children will begin bringing their book baggies home each night in the near future. Students will need help reinforcing the words, sentences and meanings of the stories when they read them to you. The two most important things you can do at home with your child are to practice recognizing letters and sounds quickly and read together every night!

### Writers' Workshop

Show and Tell Writing- Students will begin writing show and tell books about high interest items they want to share with others. Students will learn how to draw, label and write simple pattern sentences that teach about their item. Students will also have the opportunity to share what they have written with their peers.



Students will continue to work writing and representing numbers 0-10. Be sure your child counts accurately using 1:1 correspondence.

## Foundations

Students will continue to learn letter names and sounds. Students will practice writing letters using the correct letter formation. Please refer to the Foundations packet sent home in the beginning of the unit.

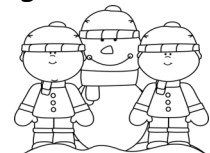
